## Ascension

The landscape is changing. Biota are forced to adapt alongside humanity to humanity - in spite of humanity. In Ascension, the spatial displacement of water (and organisms) in a structured, unnatural way creates a commentary on the increasingly forced interaction between humans and nature. A series of inverted aquariums nestled in shallow, man-made pools are on display for the visitors against a backdrop of native emergent wetland vegetation.

Surrounding these pocket ponds are arrayed plantings of native forbs with a range of seasonal color meant to complement and frame the ascending aquaria systems they contain. Some anticipated plant species tend to be more abundant in more southern locales - a nod to shifting climate and plant populations.

To augment the experience, the pathway descends slightly down into the garden, bringing the viewers to the level of the pools and to a better understanding of the nature they contain. For our world to recover, we must metaphorically descend, humbling ourselves as we seek restitution and a better understanding of nature and its incredible systems.


#### Garden Plan
