

Flowering Pantheon

Flowering Pantheon is a pavilion designed in response to the question: what kind of future do we envision for the garden? The shape is developed to be attractive to people from the outside and to embrace them and the inside garden when they are exploring the hidden environment. We propose to give people the experience of entering a temple where they are surrounded by a biodiversity garden and have the opportunity to immerse themselves in the multitude of possibilities that the garden gives us. The garden is

reflected by the inside surface's pavilion giving the sense of expansion and chance where people can be reflected to and feeling to be part of. The pavilion is characterized by a series of holes on the spiral wood's covering surface. Each hole offers an interaction: an external look to the soul of the garden and the relations between the garden with air and birds, butterflies and so on. The elements of light and water are integrated inspired by the Pantheon's hole. Similarly the open structure is naturally lit and receives rain water.

Garden

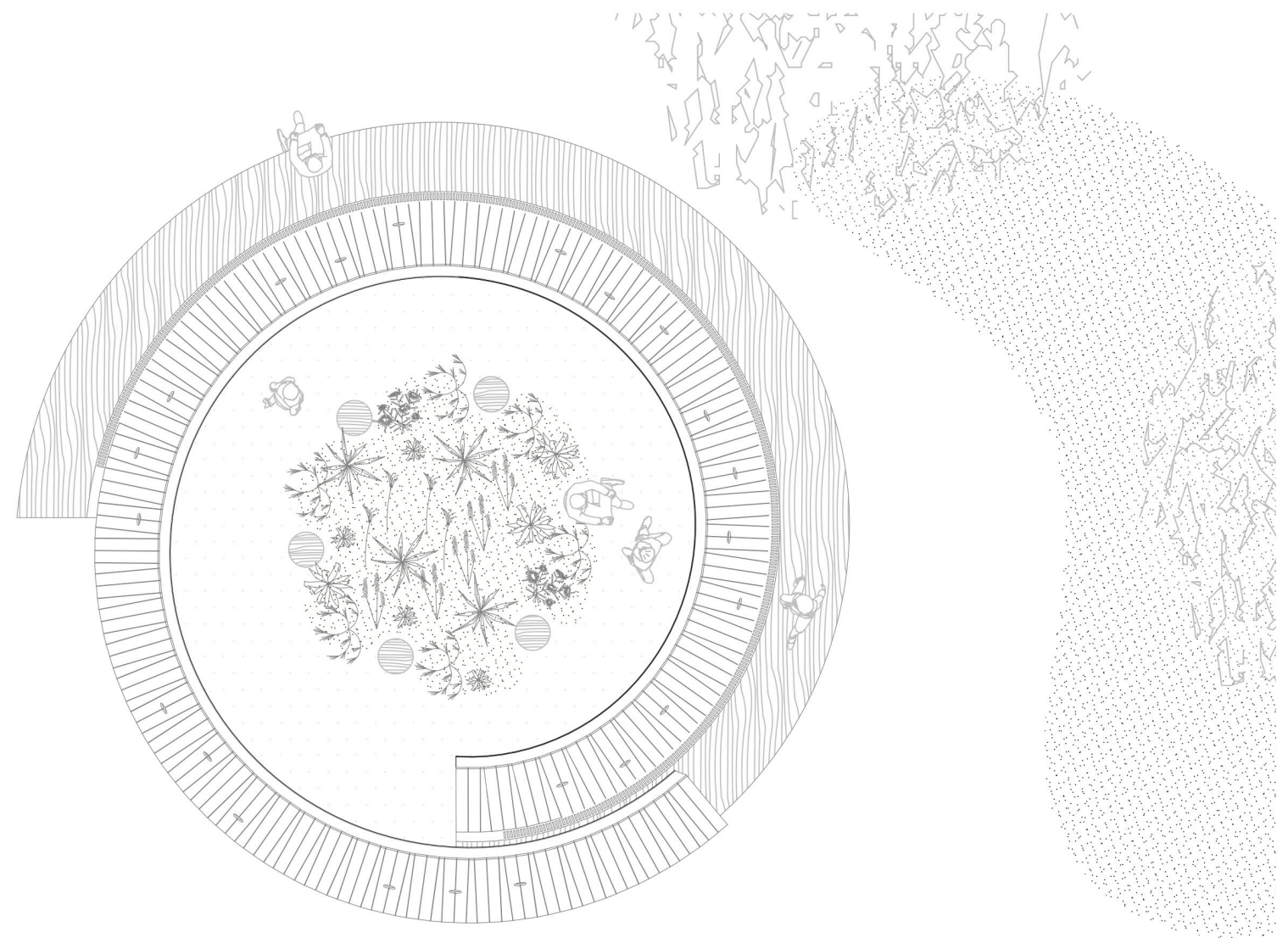
The following plant selection is based on several parameters: the hardiness of the plant (from 3 up to 9) and its climate zone, the season and its height, to design a medium-high (range 60-190 cm) garden where people can feel immersed.

Perennials:

Filipendula rubra
Solidago rugosa
Persicaria amplexicaluis
Veronicastrum
Allium sphaerocephalon
Monarda 'Scoprion'

Poaceae:

Deschamosia cespitosa
Calamagrostis canadensis
Hordeum jubatum
