## THE HOLLOW EXPERIENCE DESCRIPTION

THE HOLLOW seeks to create a habitat nook for humans, nestled along the west-east axis of the festival site. Elegant laser cut boxes showcase patterns taken from healthy riparian habitats on the exterior, while the interior utilizes the recycled off-cut pieces to create a kinetic "fringe" reminiscent of native plantings found across our shared landscapes.

Panels will be fastened to a base track that will be engraved with patterns from native sedges and rushes, providing stability during wind events and containing lights that illuminate the panels from within for nighttime interest.


The maze-like layout encourages viewers to move into the space, following the curving visual of shimmering native plant patterns towards a central area ideal for quiet contemplation of the passing of seasons, our impacts upon the natural world, and the habitats that support all members of our community.

Plantings that reference the historic cultivation of the site will reinforce the overall layout, creating a permanent imprint on the site that references both the passage of time and the impacts of people on the land, and vice versa.

## **SUGGESTED PLANTS**

Species were chosen based on edible & aesthetic qualities, the traditional focus for cultivation in Canadian gardens.
