

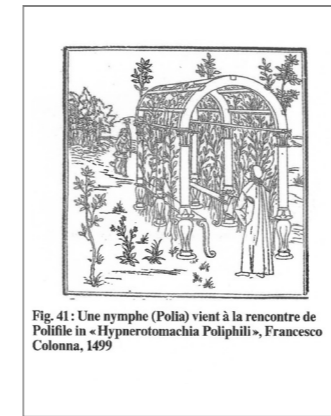
Hosting Net

Hosting Net is a self-standing structure covered with a net, designed to support various climbing plants as they grow. Installed and hosted at Le Jardin de Métis, the installation opens up a perimeter that blurs the notion of lines and borders.

The structure is made from standard aluminum parts sourced in Quebec and assembled with bolts and nuts for easy reuse (such as shelving). The netting, tailored to fit the structure like a glove, will be manufactured in Belgium.

Layered with diverse plantings—annuals, edibles, hardy, and native climbers—it evolves from a see-through filter into a lush, immersive curtain that hosts life through the seasons. Fruits hang from it, and insects find a welcoming place to nest, as *Hosting Net* invites visitors to explore a new kind of border that is alive and ever-changing.

This research-driven work takes inspiration from the art and craft of garden-making, blending texture and form to create a meeting space for people and nature.



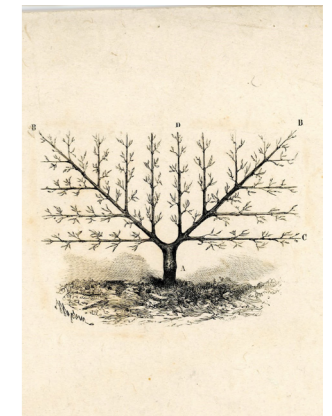
Historic trellis-plant structure



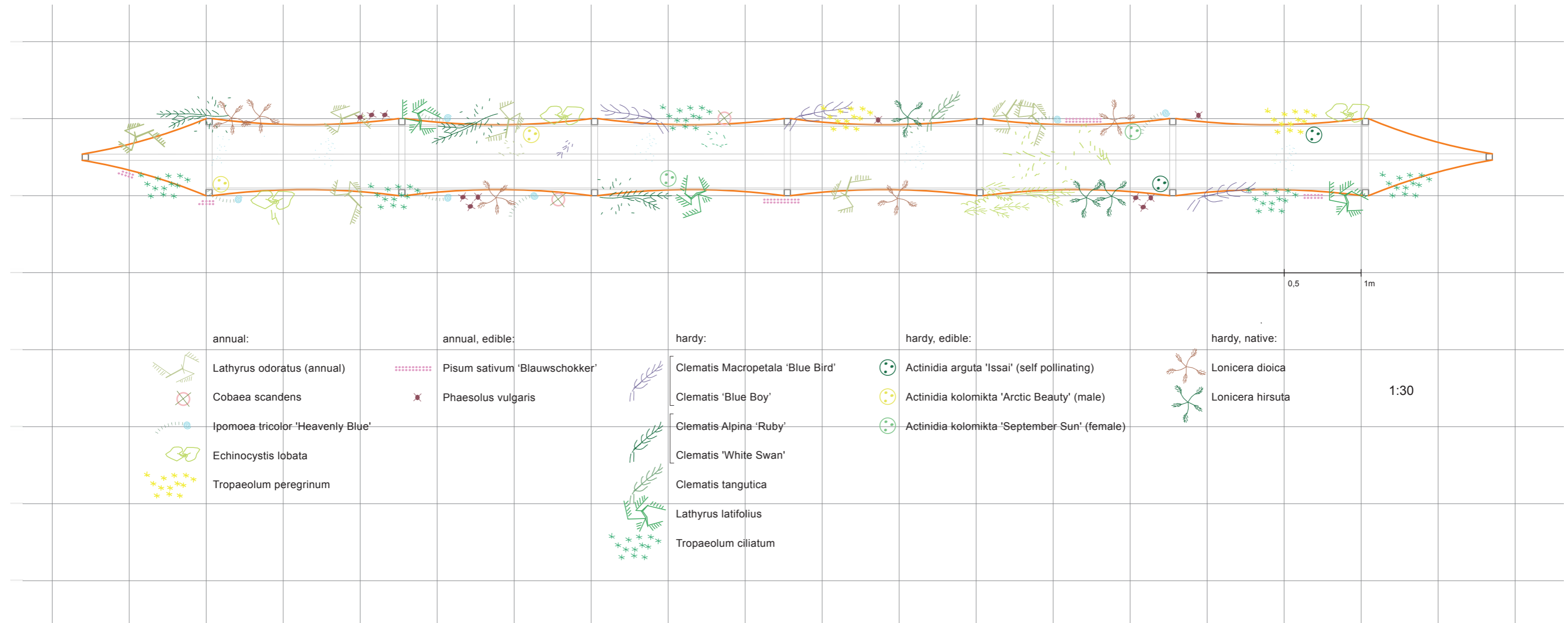

orange polyethylene net with 10mm mesh (bird-safe), assembled to fit as a glove the aluminum structure

water irrigation system (mist)

Self-supporting aluminum structure, assembled with bolts and nuts for easy assembly and disassembly

Screw foundation or another type of lightweight foundation (To be defined based on the soil type)
