



“See Beyond” is an immersive installation that invites visitors to explore their inner limits by passing through tangible barriers like polycarbonate, plastic mesh, tulle, and nylon threads. These materials represent different types of psychological obstacles, from evident blocks to subtle insecurities and unconscious limits, evoking feelings of vulnerability, fear, and uncertainty. Arranged in a zigzag path, these transparent barriers symbolize the uneven journey people often face in overcoming doubts and fears. The pathway encourages visitors to slow down and reflect on each limit, questioning how their thoughts shape their reality. The rigid, visible polycarbonate evokes tangible fears, while the nearly invisible nylon threads call to mind self-sabotaging thoughts that often go unnoticed. As visitors move through the path, they are encouraged to consider how many of these obstacles are self-created and to explore possible paths to freedom. At the end of the journey, a symbolic message inspires them to envision a life without these barriers, leaving them with a sense of openness and potential for personal growth.
