

Wander Wall

As visitors approach the garden, they encounter a series of colourful barriers that divide the north from the south of the garden. Rather than creating a continuous separation, each wall stands independently allowing visitors to wander through them inviting exploration, adventure, and contemplation. The monolithic walls

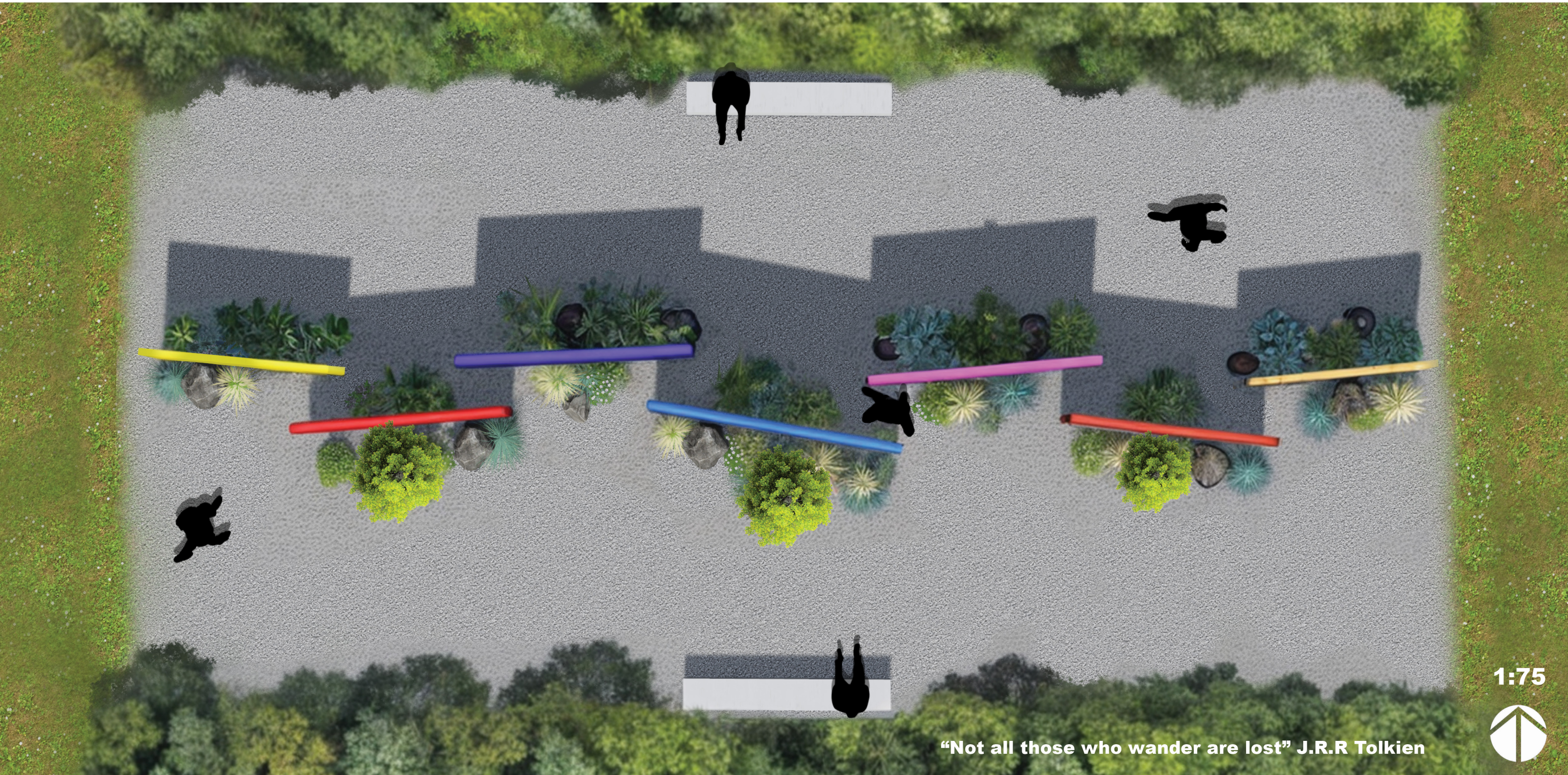
are composed of timber frames clad in painted plywood, each with its own saturated colour evoking a series of emotional responses from visitors as they pass. The experience of the plants and colours change as visitors cross the threshold from the north to the south. Cool shade loving plants border the walls on the north side in contrast to the bright sun bathed plants in the south. Each plant grouping is framed by the wall behind it, providing a strong contrast between built and natural forms. Rectangular cube benches offer a place to rest and reflect on the experience of both sides, giving visitors time to process and discuss the perceptual shifts that happen within the space. Mystery and wonder are around every corner, this becomes clear as barriers become porous, borders fracture, and possibilities appear.
