

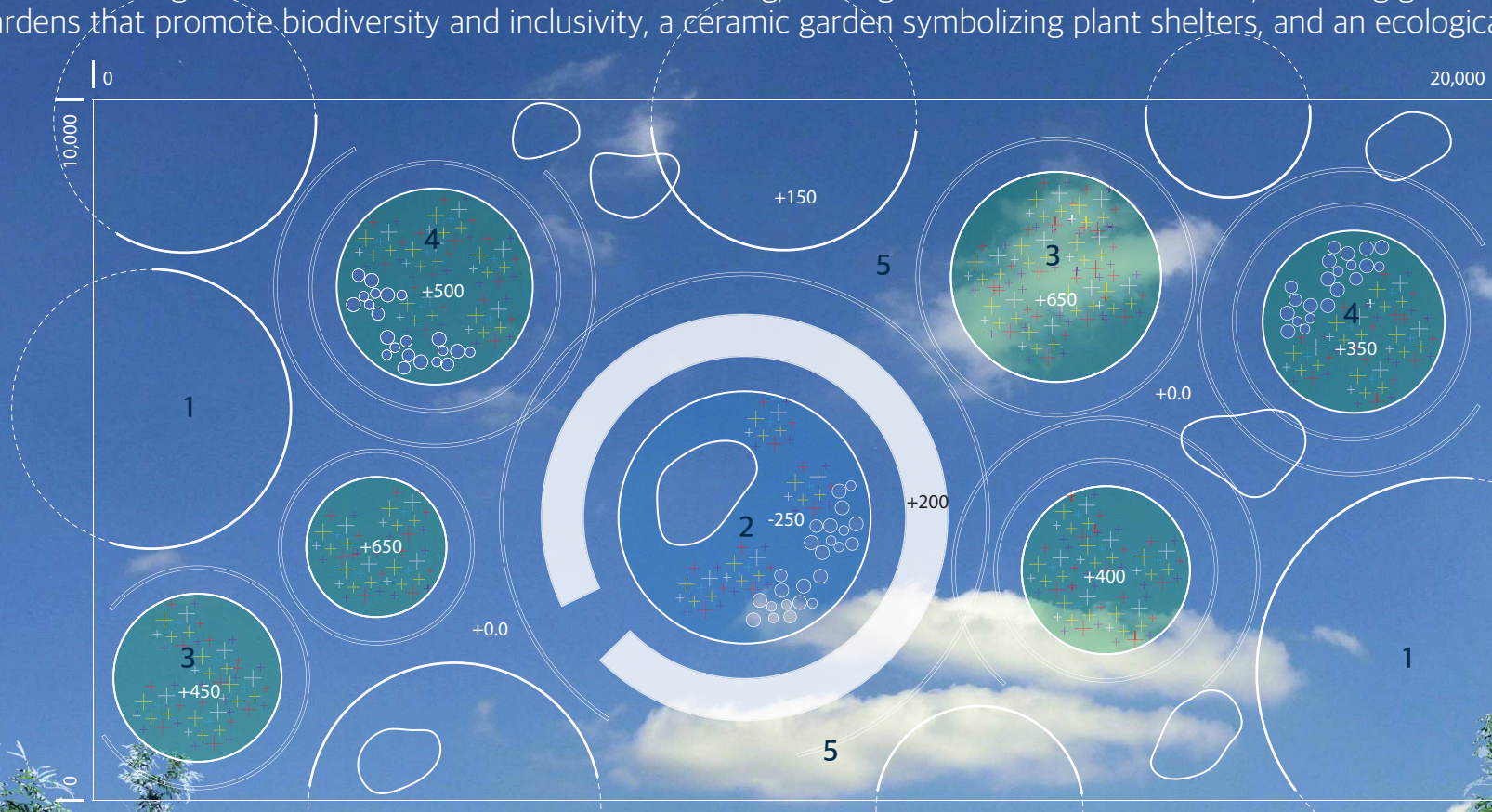
Concentric Circle

- 5. Ecological Pebble Bed



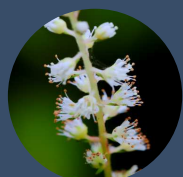

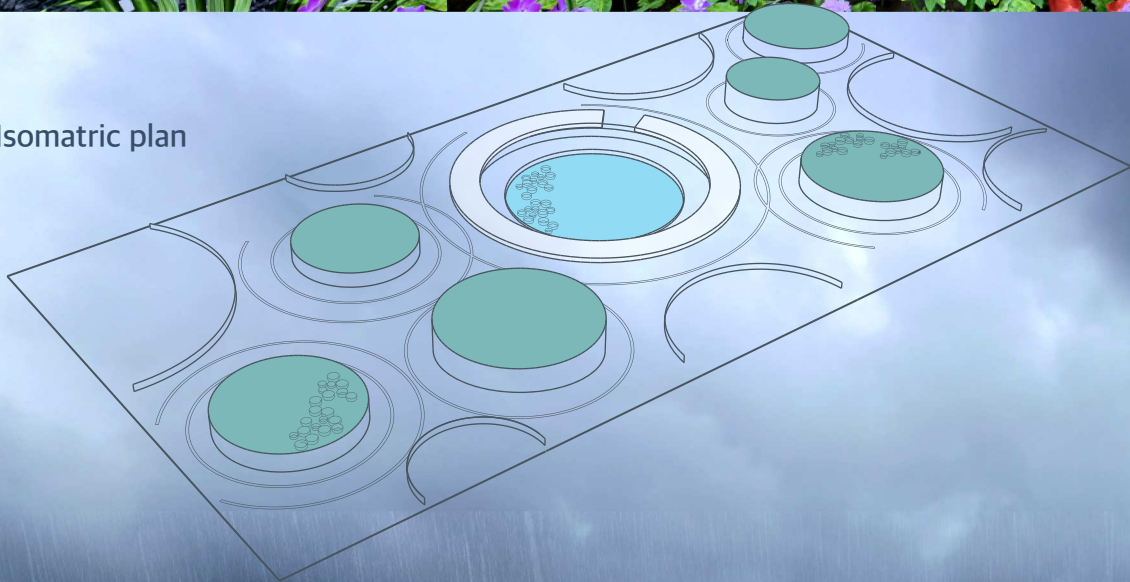
