



***The Garden of Feast & Famine*** is an interactive installation transforming a banquet table and chairs into a pithy commentary about our **global relationship with abundance and scarcity**. Responding to the impacts of climate change on food security, *The Garden of Feast & Famine* invites visitors to ‘take a seat at the table’ – literally – to consider gardens, food production, and the inequitable necessity for adaptation around the world. Joining the table is radically different from one end to the other. While the tabletop remains level, the ground underfoot shifts in an undulating **earthwork**. At one head, a visitor may simply sit down at the feast; at the other, they must climb a tall ladder to gain a place at the table. **While the commentary is serious, the interaction is playful:** visitors are invited to picnic at the table or rest on the hill. A series of dinners can be programmed for the space. Children will transform the installation into a jungle gym. *The Garden of Feast & Famine* embodies the need for adaptation and, ultimately, change, in our swiftly shifting world.
