A sheet of expanded metal, with the shape of a rhizome, 8 steel pipes as roots, 8 holes in the ground as blossoms, filled with native plants (green), non-native plants (red) and empty to let nature find who is the strongest pioneer (blue).

PLANTS INDICATION

Green Hole: Native plants divided in herbaceous plants and flowering plants.

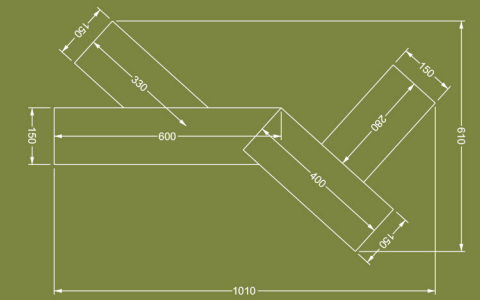
Red Hole: Exotic plants

The visitor can see an upside down world, Rhizome is the chance to see what is naturally hidden and be amazed by nature and its power of regeneration.

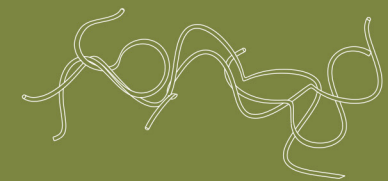

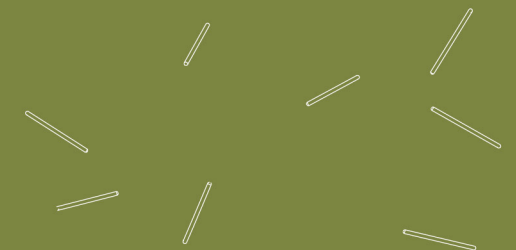
RHIZOME in SHEET of EXPANDED METAL



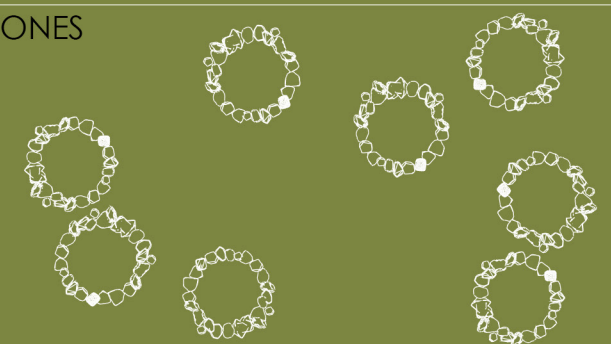
COLORED PLASTIC PIPES inside RHIZOME



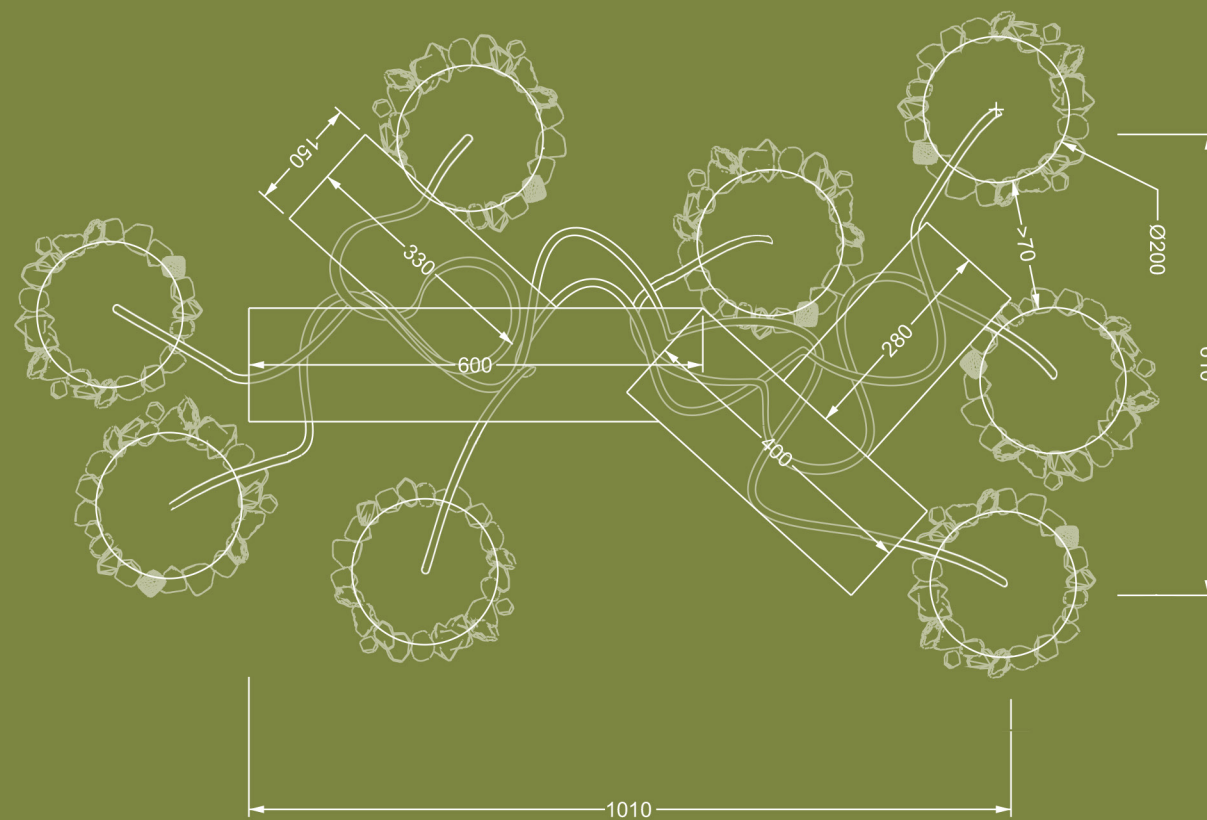
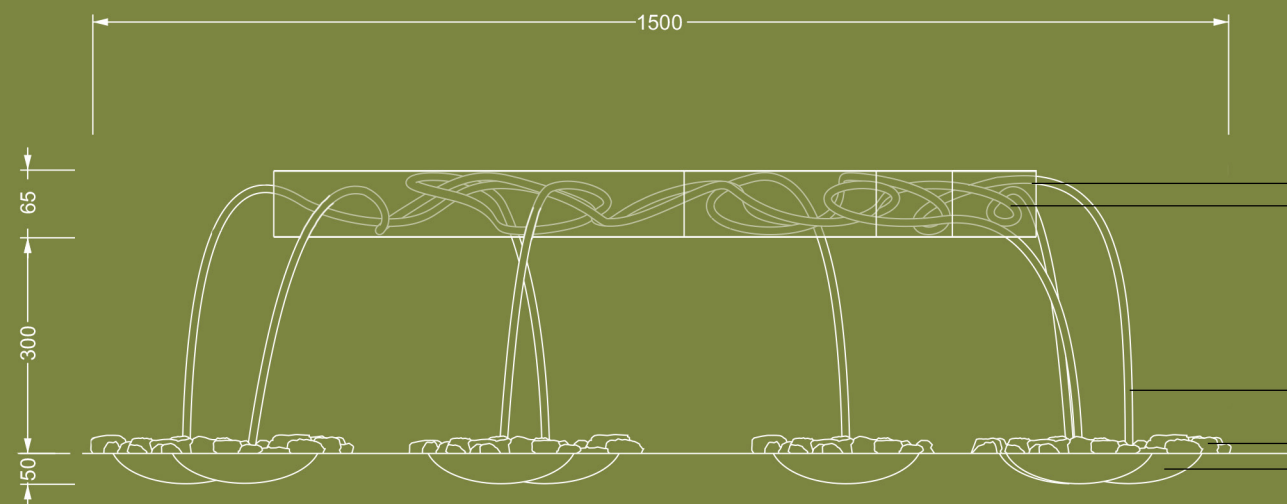
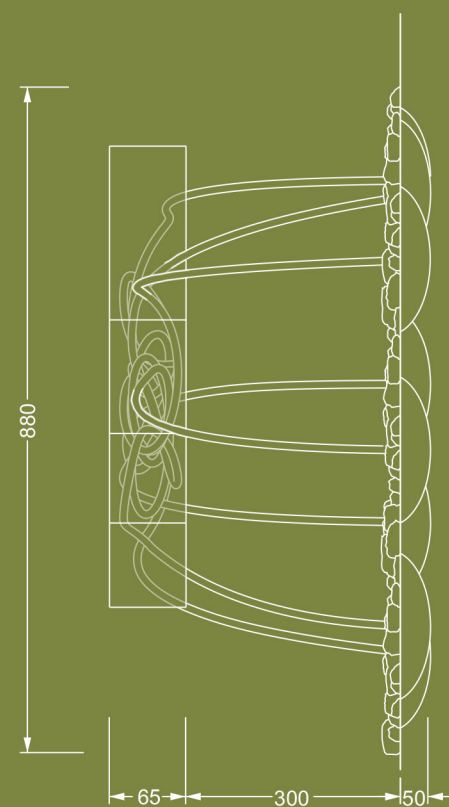
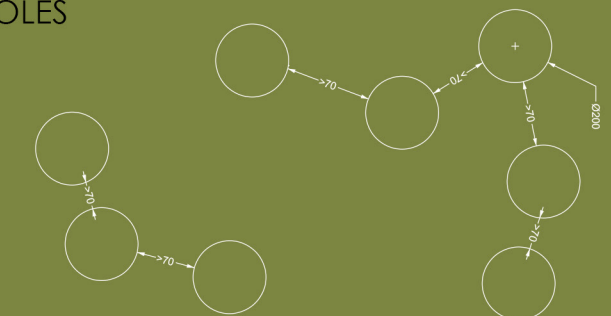

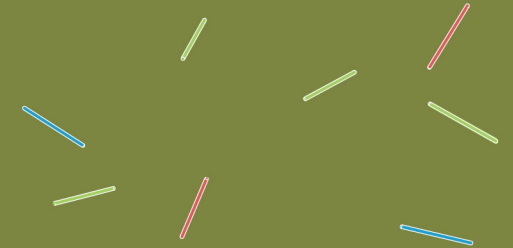
RHIZOME in SHEET of EXPANDED METAL



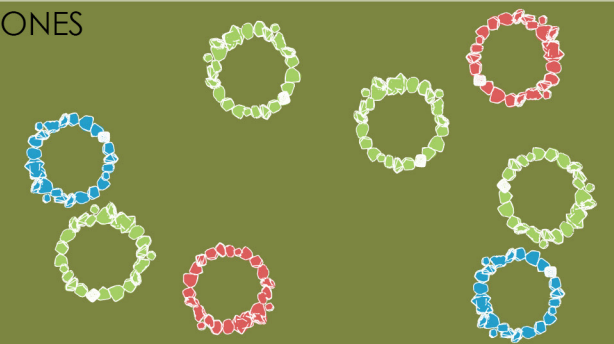
