KATOS uses the trees in the area with as little processing as possible as part of the garden. They are load-bearing pillars, utilizing nature's own design and at the same time enabling the surprising appearance created by organic shapes.

The trees are felled without damaging the branches, after which the bark and sap layer are removed with a high-pressure washer. The peeling method leaves the surface of the tree untouched and natural, as if the bark had fallen off by itself over time.


KATOS consists of whole trees, a timber grid as canopy, a soft forest floor and with planks connecting pathways to walk on. Whole trees which together with the branches connected to the lattice structure of the canopy create rigid structure. Canopy reminiscent of foliage, through which daylight filters. The visitor is guided through the KATOS with a wooden trail made from wide planks, around which the ground grows mossy bog, berries and other plants familiar from the coniferous forest floor.




