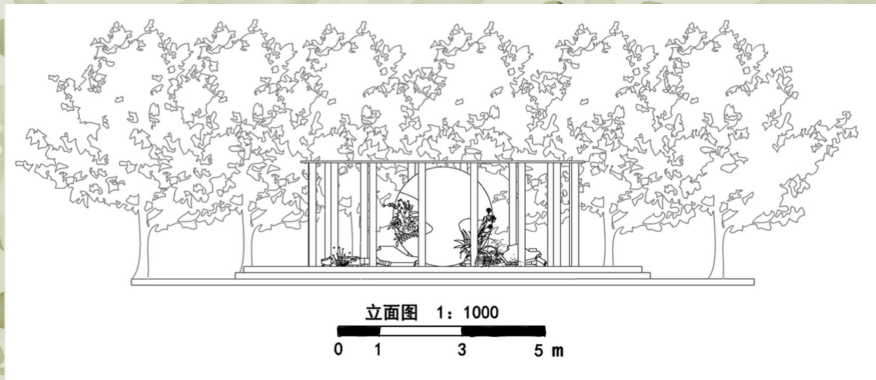


# ROTTEN TENDER BUDS

## Tender buds:

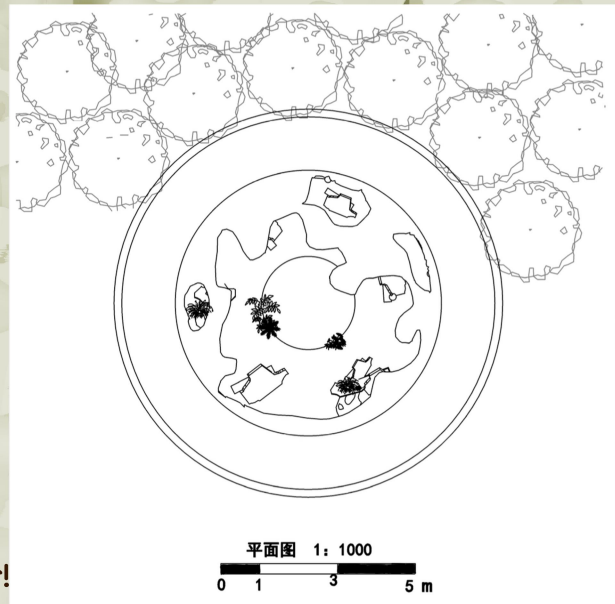

## Interactivity:

Tourists can use any tool they have to knock on this spherical body, and as they continue to 'destroy', the interior of the sphere reveals the true face of Mount Lu - not the vibrant green, but the withered yellow grass. Echoing the large theme circle, the periphery is a cylindrical shape supported by columns, and the interior is a spherical shape.

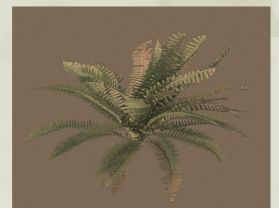
The hollowed out shape at the top is based on the shape of the Earth's continental plate, and the internal fragments are consistent with the hollowed out shape above, indicating the Earth's precariousness.



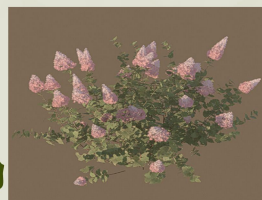
