



























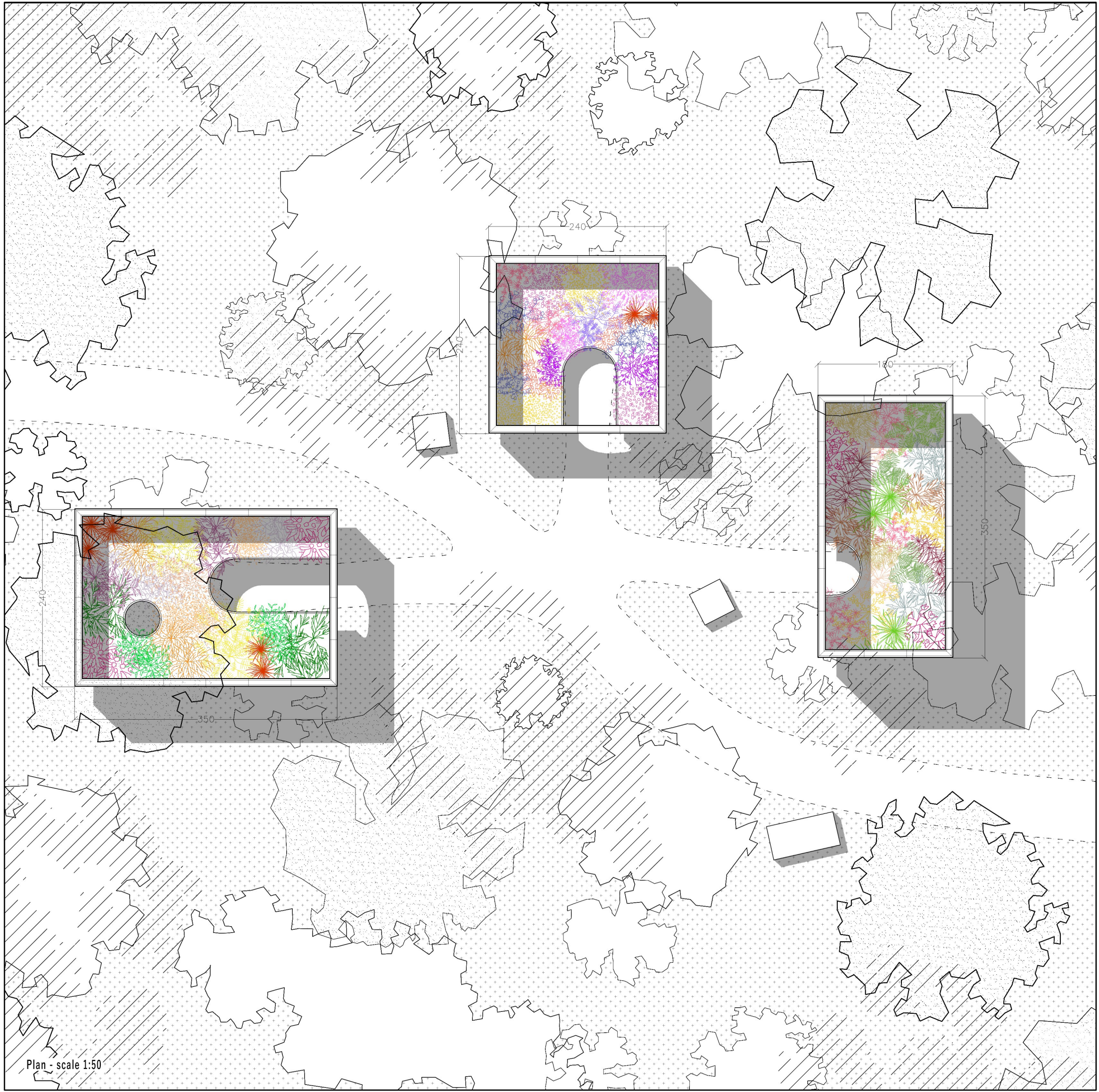


# Find your nature

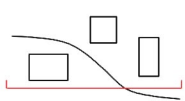
The structure consists of enigmatic wooden parallelepipeds of different sizes, three intimate sanctuaries on pillars which are accessed through narrow openings. Designed for solo exploration, each box invites a single visitor to the entrance to which a small portion of nature is revealed. The architecture is reduced to a few signs that constitute a neutral backdrop necessary to contain a miniature garden, tapestry of different tree species to admire. The movement is precluded, the views forced. Despite the direct experience, without ever being able to be fully part of it, the natural environment remains an unreachable goal favoring an intimate connection but transcending the ordinary. We are thus forced to soliloquy, meditative observations and reflections trying to grasp, also, the vibrating vacuum and the irresistible beauty of the fenced garden. Essential elements: an organic space delimited by single elements of a single material (recovered and recyclable raw wood), few ingredients able to invite visitors to stop, breathe and confront intimately with the deep beauty of vegetation capable of generating meaningful relationships in the minds and bodies of those who inhabit them.

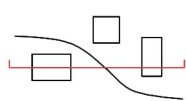

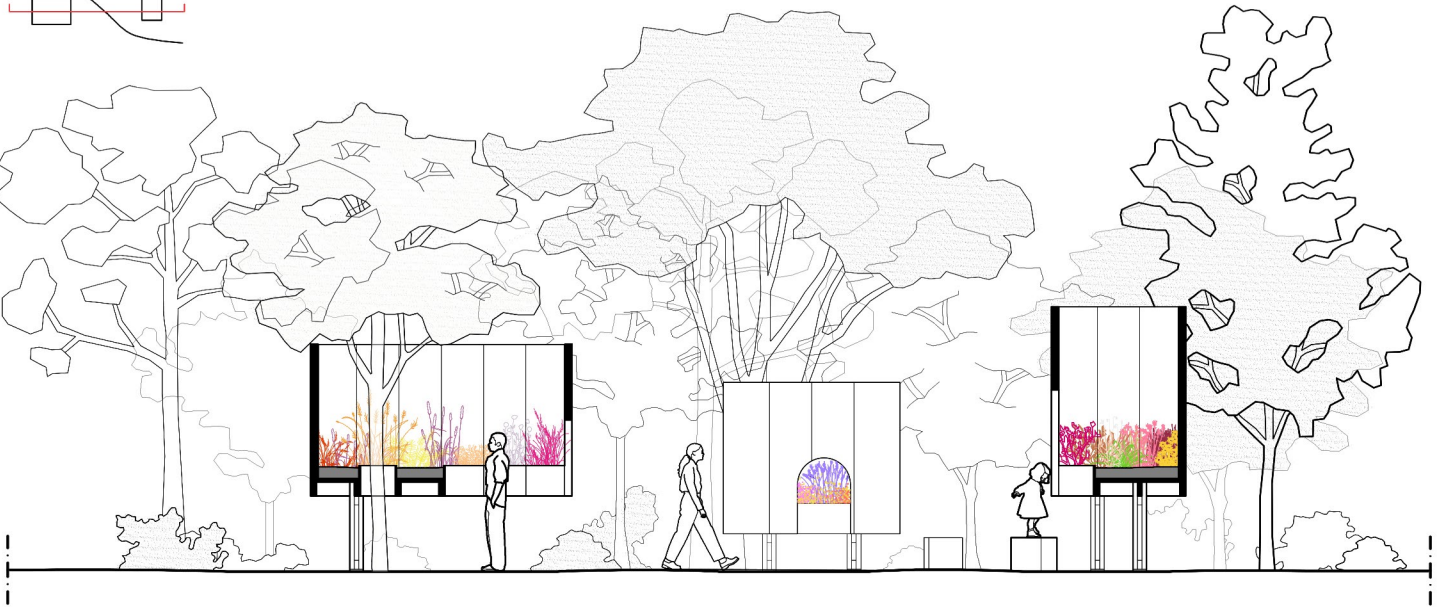




Profile elevation - scale 1:100
