our visionary project, addresses the pressing issue of declining pollinator populations due to pollution, chemical misuse, diseases, and climate change. It is a rain garden dedicated to providing a lifeline for pollinators like bees and butterflies, as well as a sanctuary for birds.

At the heart of BUZZisco is our commitment to biodiversity and sustainability. Over 99% of the project is composed of compostable materials, ensuring minimal environmental impact. We've meticulously selected native plant species, making up at least 85% of the garden, to attract and sustain pollinators throughout the seasons.

The landscape will be sculpted with a swale and landscape berms, combining functionality and aesthetics. BUZZisco will feature three distinctive 'bug nests' and birdhouses, each designed to take visitors on a sentimental journey, connecting with the personal roots and heritage of the designer. These structures provide shelter and nesting sites for insects and birds while offering a deeply personal and meaningful experience.

Inside the bug hotels, various materials like straws, hay, dry leaves, sticks, dead wood, bark, corrugated cardboard, and cones will be arranged to cater to our insect friends' needs.

BUZZisco not only captivates with its beauty but also stands as a symbol of our dedication to environmental sustainability. It's a space for visitors to immerse themselves in ecological restoration, reconnect with nature, and rekindle our commitment to a sustainable future.

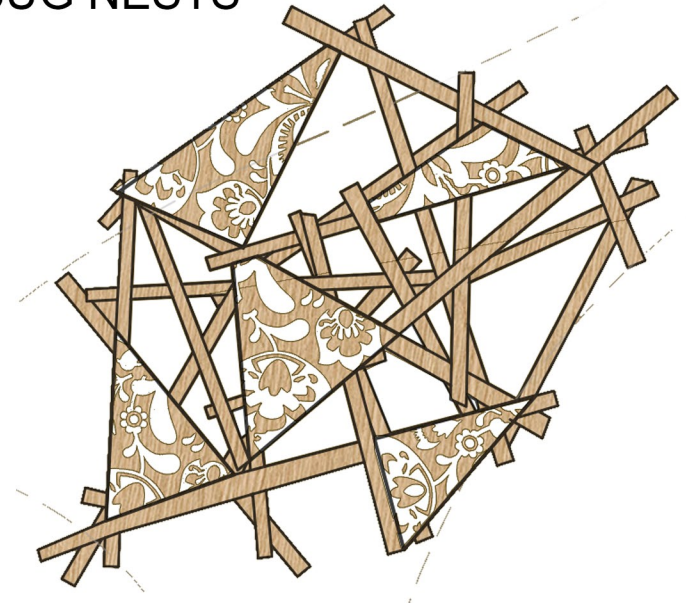
