
# **SHADOW GARDEN ----**


### **DESCRIPTION**

The proposed garden form consists of two complementary parts that fill a cubic spatial structure. The outer part is a spatial frame measuring 4.5 x 4.5 x 4.5 m, made of raw wooden poles. It holds the inner form. The inner part is a simple cone shape made of a frame covered with canvas, which you can enter. Between the outer frame and the inner cone, there is space for climbing plants to grow. Over time, these plants will create more shadows inside the cone - the initial shadows will change to light patterns as the plants fill in. When you enter the cone, you cross the border from the real world into what is merely an image. The outside world changes slowly (with wind, sunlight, and plant growth), while the inside remains still and peaceful. Only the shadows and light at the edge of these spaces help us understand the world as a whole.



This design reflects how people today experience a reality that is often duplicated or replaced by artificial environments.
