


Territory of Trees

A garden is not constituted by human rationality as a spectacle, it awakens a sensitivity toward nature. *Territory of Trees* composes a series of tensile structures encircling trunks according to the span of their canopies, mapping the treescape as claimed by roots beyond our sight. Each structure consists of a lightweight net anchored by a taller inner ring and a lower outer ring. The catenary curves of the nets manifest a field of energy, gravitating toward the trees while inviting participants to balance and dwell within. The spaces between trunks may appear arbitrary and generous, yet one may immediately sense the intimacy and breath of their subterranean territories while moving through the interstices. The design does not assume a top-down mapping through mechanic projection; it undertakes a bottom-up close examination of the treescape, an archaeological attitude of humility that patiently traces the quiet continuity of roots, soil, and air. This intertwined network of nature is remapped through the presence of visitors, where encounter gives form to perception itself.


Plants Suggestions:

Territory of Trees is a mapping of the existing birch forest (or other tree species) at the site along the west-east axis.




Plan Drawing
