



# MOSS GARDEN



plan


To respond to the design theme, this project focuses on scale — the crucial element in mapping. When it comes to moss, our observation scale must be magnified dozens or even hundreds of times. It means that within the same plot area, the living space occupied by other larger plant individuals is equivalent to that of a large moss population or even an entire moss community.

This design project proposes a small platform measuring 6000mm by 900mm, designed for moss growth. Positioned at eye level, it facilitates close-up observation of moss growth, thereby functioning as a moss garden. The platform is housed within a wooden pavilion, providing a shaded, moist environment conducive to moss growth while harmonizing in scale with both the surrounding large plants and human dimensions. When visitors engage with the project, they are essentially shifting between different distinct spatial scales: building, human, moss garden, and individual moss, which is the interpretation of this design project to the theme of “mapping sensitivity”.


