## Interwoven

Our garden installation draws inspiration from mycorrhizal networks, the subterranean system through which organisms communicate, share vital resources, and sustain one another. These invisible connections embody a silent cooperation, allowing nature to adapt and regenerate.

In an era of global fragmentation and social isolation, the garden emerges as a space of poetic resistance, inviting visitors to reflect on connection, empathy, and collective care.


Titled Interwoven, the installation translates this sensitive natural mapping into a tactile and immersive experience. The structure consists of FSC-certified local timber posts and beams, supporting a suspended network of taut, 100% recycled Polyester filaments. This assembly evokes the invisible bonds between living beings, creating a dynamic map that interacts with light and wind.

The structural nodes, where elegant vegetation blooms, serve as focal points for aggregation, encouraging people to pause and connect. The geometric threads project their shadows onto the ground, defining natural pathways.


Through this interplay, visitors experience the resilience and solidarity inherent in nature, rediscovering the value of cooperation and collective responsibility in nurturing life.

## Suggested plants


1. *Hydrangea arborescens* 'Annabelle' (Bush)

4. *Lonicera sempervirens* (Climber)




Plan, 1:100
