




# LET'S DINE TOGETHER

## Big Table for Sharing

At the center of the ring sits a tabletop constructed from exterior-grade wooden boards, each measuring 1 × 1 meter. Four sizes of circular openings are cut through the surface, allowing plants to emerge directly from the soil below and grow through the table. One large opening contains a shallow stainless-steel basin that provides safe drinking water for birds and small mammals, while the others are planted with edible and stagger-blooming species that offer color and texture throughout the seasons. Visitors are invited to sow seeds and observe their growth over the course of the exhibition, becoming active participants in the evolving landscape.

The tabletop and the excavated pit are intentionally offset, creating areas of varying depth for seating and rest. The deepest point offers a comfortable reclining space. The overall excavation is limited to 0.4–0.7 meters—just enough to establish a sunken seating zone. Footrests at different heights ensure that both adults and children can sit comfortably, while small animals can also find perches around the edge. The circular retaining walls are built from pressure-treated wood plank, designed for easy removal and reuse once the exhibition concludes, emphasizing the project's commitment to adaptability and sustainability.
