


# Unfixed

These are not fixed but constantly changing, transforming through interactions with the external world. Sensitivity Mapping embodies this complexity and subtlety of the human mind within spatial experience. The space is not merely an external environment but deeply connected to the inner state of individuals, where personal emotions and memories are reflected and projected.

Buddhism fundamentally explores the “inner mind” and the essence of existence. Based on the philosophy of impermanence and interdependence, it expresses that all beings rely on one another and are in continuous transformation. Through this, the garden becomes more than a visual space—it becomes an “inner map” where users experience interaction between mind and space. Visitors discover their own emotions and newly perceive their relationship with the environment. By merging the essence of Sensitivity Mapping with Buddhist philosophy, the garden becomes a relational, multi-layered, and healing space that embraces emotion, thought, and existence.





The central stone pagoda, representing enlightenment, is approached by eight stone bridges symbolizing the Noble Eightfold Path, where users focus on the "present moment" through concentration, breathing, and mindfulness by stacking stones.

The Dharma Wheel space is a meditation area for communicating with nature, where users empty their minds of afflictions, cultivate wisdom, and strive for enlightenment.

▲ The Flower of Dependent Origination : An Ethereal Visualization

An installation, inspired by the lotus symbolizing purity and enlightenment from suffering, visually embodies the Buddhist principle of Dependent Origination (Yeongibup) by trapping and continually releasing smoke for an ethereal effect.
