




Kiki and Bouba are two abstract shapes that are used in a psychological experiment that demonstrates an association between sounds and shapes. Typically, Kiki is determined as sharper and more defined. Bouba is often determined to be softer, with gentler curves, lacking hard edges or corners. The goal of this design to use the differences between Kiki and Bouba to play on a person's sensitivity to their environment. The garden is split into two sections, one designed with Kiki in mind, the other with Bouba. By using the sharp, hard edges of Kiki paired with a warm color palette we aim to create a garden that feels edgy and structured. The intended effect is a garden that feels invigorating and exciting. The opposite is intended with the Bouba garden. The soft edges, natural feel, and cool color palette of the Bouba garden is meant to elicit a calm and peaceful reflection. The two sides are split by a mirror wall which serves as a way to divide the space, create the illusion of space, and further emphasize the differences.
