L A N D S C A P E F R O M M E M O R Y

This garden is made as a fragmented composition, set out on an elongated grid where the carefully displaced arrangement of plants align with a secondary grid of diagonals. The highly abstract visual composition is primarily structured by hedges cut into shapes of pyramids, their strong geometric form guide the eye towards coves of variegated planting on the ground, and at the nodes of the grid, tall but slender gradient chromatic mirrors. The reflective posts further abstract the spatial composition but also introduce the dimension of time to the landscape by

tinting views with the many gradients of dusk and dawn, as well as casting distinct elongated shadows - an animated grid. The ground is also scattered with shallow reflecting pools that showcase movements of the sky. Visitors engage in a playful discovery, experiencing the character of planting immediately by the orthogonal paths or by observing a confluence of fragments along the oblique planting grid. Unfamiliarly shaped matter we know allows focus to shift to the thingness of things and spark recognitions, connecting our memories to here and now.


