

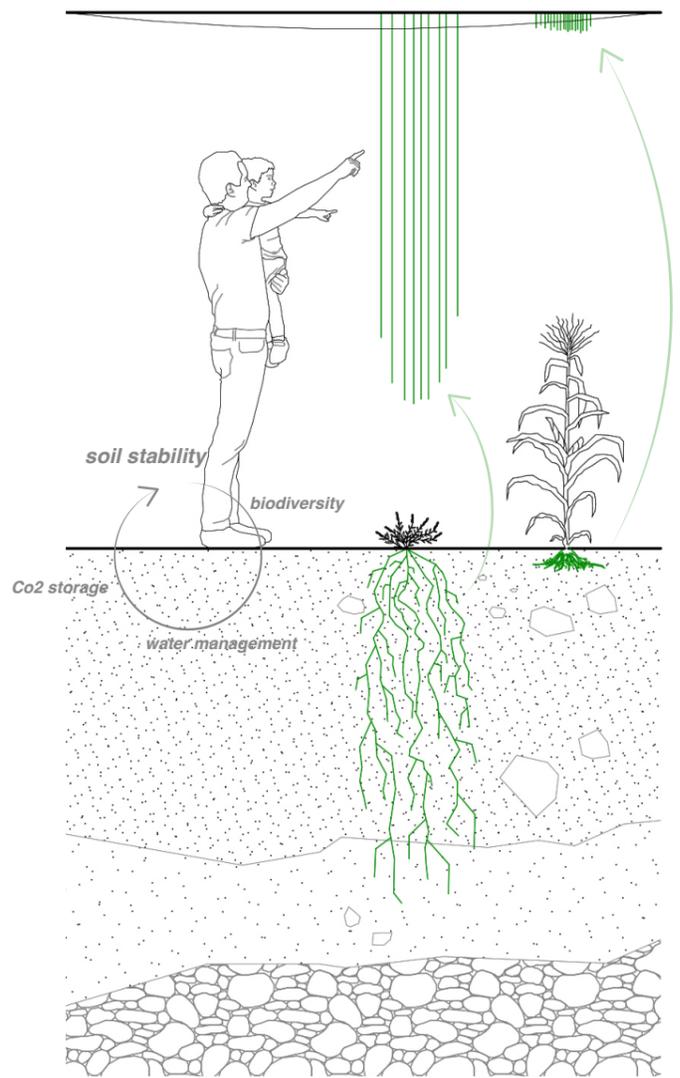
Radical Sensitivity

Radical Sensitivity invites us to reimagine how we perceive the living world. The word *Radical* comes from the Latin *radix, radicis*, meaning *root*, a reminder of origin and the foundations of life itself.

We are used to experiencing plants only through what our senses can immediately detect: their sight, smell, and touch, the visible surface of life. Yet beneath lies a vast and vital world, where roots reveal the true bases of growth.

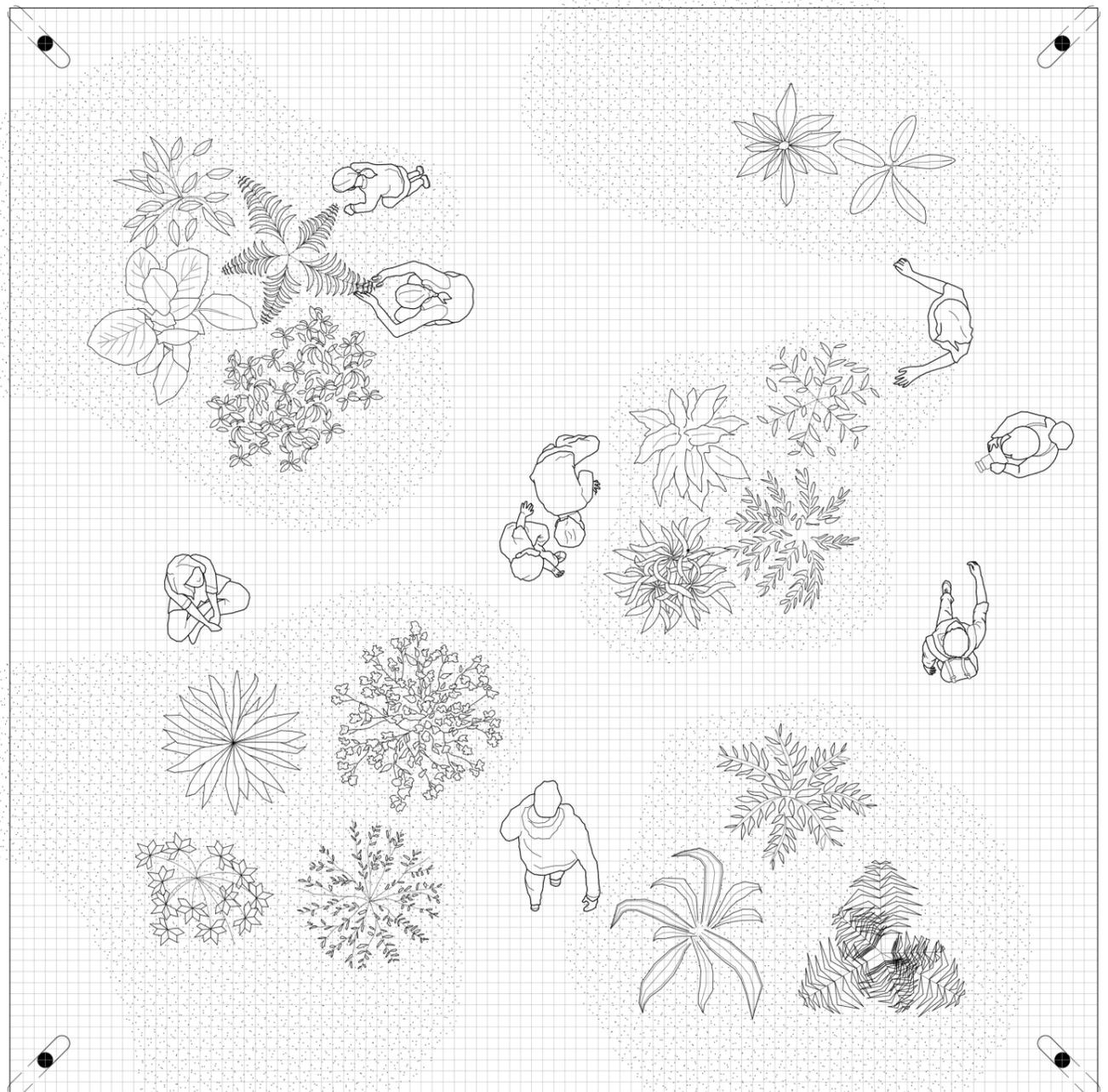
A small plant may extend deep underground, while a tall one might root close to the surface. These hidden systems depend on healthy soil, the living medium that nourishes roots, sustains plants, and supports the balance of entire ecosystems.

By drawing attention to this invisible layer and offering a *perspective change*, the installation reveals how the health of soil, roots, and plants is closely intertwined with the biodiversity above ground.
