Concept

“**Summer Drift**” is inspired by the work of Guy Debord and the Situationists, a Paris-based art collective active in the 1960s who pioneered the concept of a *dérive* —an alternative method of mapping centered around an unplanned, dream-like excursion, or “drift” through space where the participants allow spontaneous moments to guide their journey through a landscape. In the garden, a long curving line of plants is framed by boulders that serve as both boundaries and a seated respite. The boulders break the elliptical path, sending the visitor on a journey into the planted interior cove. As summer unfolds, blooms emerge sequentially along the line - beginning in June at one end and gradually spreading - encouraging exploration through changing waves of color. Visitors will make their own desire lines by traversing the sedge lawn, whose long blades will map the footprints of visitors as they explore how the space changes through ephemeral summer blooms. A trail camera in the birch trees on site will capture daily images of how the garden changes over the summer.




