
Title: *This Land is My Land, This Land is Your Land*

Concept:

This Land is My Land, This Land is Your Land is a two-part sculptural garden installation mapping the emotional and social geographies of belonging within the Canadian landscape. Through two mirrored circles of Muskoka chairs, one closed, one open, the work transforms a familiar national icon into a sensitive cartography of inclusion and exclusion.

Visitors are invited to reflect on how shared spaces can both connect and divide, how belonging is shaped by access, memory, and perception. Between the two circles lies a quiet threshold where exclusion gives way to inclusion, a spatial dialogue that unfolds through movement, sound, and light. Each visitor's journey completes the work, turning this landscape into a living map of belonging.
