


# REVERIE VEIL


The garden is designed to awaken hidden sensitivities by inviting visitors to recall memories through intangible stimuli such as light, wind, and subtle scents. By omitting material elements, the space encourages a pure, inward-focused engagement with one's sensory and emotional experiences.

Visitors enter a semi-enclosed area made of steel frameworks and fabrics, immersing themselves in their feelings and perceptions. The movement of fabric, along with strategically arranged hanging plants and grasses, visually expresses these hidden sensitivities, creating a dreamlike, immersive environment.


Hammock-style resting areas allow visitors to experience the garden in various postures, emphasizing bodily freedom. This concept is based on the belief that physical freedom fosters mental freedom. By relaxing their bodies, visitors can expand cognitive flexibility and heighten sensitivity.


